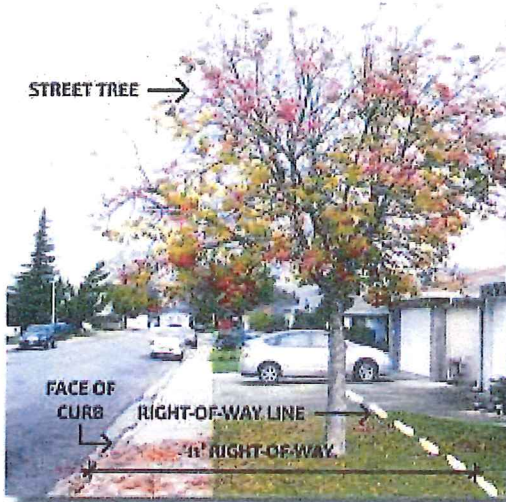

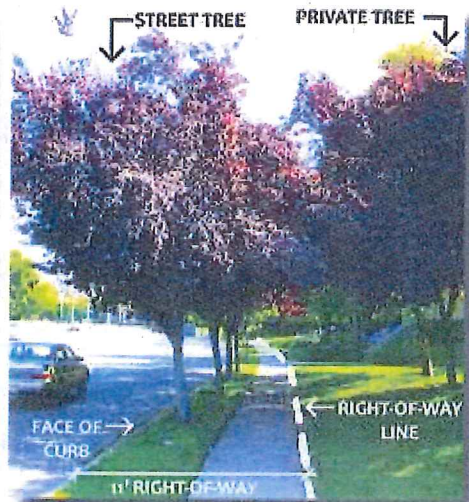

PLANTING DATE: April 9, 2016

- Trees will be planted on right of way easements, common space or parks; no back yards
- Shade trees are planted 40 feet apart and ornamental 20 feet apart, modifications to this are at the discretion of the City
- Tree selection and locations are at the discretion of the City representatives.
- 6Ft. tall Bare root tree, tree gator, and necessary staking is provided free of charge. Tree Gator must be returned in the fall and are property of the City.
- Homeowners are expected to keep water in the tree gators for the first season
- Homeowners must have an automated irrigation system and must be in an established lawn, if the planting space is in turf.
- If planting in rock mulch or wood chips it should be cleared in the proposed planting space prior to planting.
- Trees that are planted in the right of way are property of the City of Grand Junction. As a partnership, the homeowner or HOA is responsible for proper watering and ensuring the health of the tree(s). The City provides pruning, removals, and replacements.
